French Polynesia. Those two words alone no doubt conjure up visions of emerald and sapphire waters, pearl-white beaches and tropical paradise. Abundant are coral reefs, dolphins and whales, lagoons, and of course, the fish: Bonefish, Giant Trevally, Black Trevally, Bluefin Trevally, Wahoo, Jacks, Cuberra Snappers, Blue and Black Marlin, Yellow fin Tuna, Bonito, Dog Tooth Tuna and hundreds more. Come and discover the unspoiled Tuamotu Archipel area of Tahiti and experience unbelievable fly fishing (some bonefish have weighed in between 14 and 16 pounds). Tuamotu Archipelago is the largest reef concentration in the world, with more miles of reef than the great barrier in Australia. The bonefish of the Tuamotu Islands belongs to the *Albulae-Glossodonta* species, which are bigger, stronger and heavier than any other bonefish.

You will fish and play on the luxurious Humana, a 115 ft. yacht with teak decks and Jacuzzi that can accommodate 40 guests in 20 deluxe cabins, all with ocean views. A 45-seat restaurant is located on the main deck that offers a sumptuous international menu. Explore the Rangiroa Atoll, the second largest atoll in the world, with an abundance of reefs, sand inlets, coconut palms, rivers and flats. The entire Tuamotu Archipelago area is a remarkable biosphere zone. Experienced fishing guides (a mix of English speaking and local Tahitian) have access to an oval reef of more than 150 miles long.

Tahiti is just eight hours from Los Angeles. A representative will greet you and assist you aboard Air Tahiti, then on to Rangiroa, which is just an hour away. Or if you prefer, spend the night in Papeete and leave for Rangiroa the next day. To escape from the maddening crowd and to truly relax surrounded by this out-of-the-way, little known jewel of a place, call us for more information.
